Finn Laursen is Professor of International Politics in the Department of Political Science, University of Southern Denmark, Odense. He holds a Ph.D. from the University of Pennsylvania (1980). He has held research fellowships at the European University Institute, Florence, and Princeton University. Previous appointments include London School of Economics (1985-88) and the European Institute of Public Administration, Maastricht (1988-95). He was Head of the Torquil Kristensen Institute, Esbjerg, 1995-98. He is currently Director of the Centre for European Studies (CFES) at University of Southern Denmark. He is also President of the Danish Society for European Studies.
